- Mission is teaching, sanctifying, and governing/ruling
- Responsibility from clergy to laity (Before and After Second Vatican Council)
- Hierarchical governing (versus our representative democracy)

- Priest (Monsignor is a Priest)
- Deacon (Transitional and Permanent)

Clergy receives the Sacrament of Ordination



Handed down through generations – "living transmission"




Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition = "Sacred Deposit" of the Faith is handed on One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church

Institution - Magisterium of the Church

But the task of authentically interpreting the word of God, whether written or handed on, has been entrusted exclusively to the living teaching office of the Church, whose authority is exercised in the name of Jesus Christ. This teaching office is not above the word of God, but serves it, teaching only what has been handed on, listening to it devoutly, guarding it scrupulously and explaining it faithfully in accord with a divine commission and with the help of the Holy Spirit, it draws from this one deposit of faith everything which it presents for belief as divinely revealed.

- The Body of Christ (Romans 12 and 1 Corinthians 12)
- People of God (1 Peter 2:9)
- This group is a Christian Community!

Church as Sacrament

The Sacraments and Christian Life

Christ instituted the sacraments of the new law. There are seven: Baptism, Confirmation (or Chrismation), the Eucharist, Penance, the Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony. The seven sacraments touch all the stages and all the important moments of Christian life: they give birth and increase, healing and mission to the Christian's life of faith. There is thus a certain resemblance between the stages of natural life and the stages of the spiritual life.

- Christ and the Church (Ephesians 5:32)




- Mission is Evangelism
